

Plan components, 2012 Planning Rule

... from Susan Jane Brown...

Purpose of plan components: guide future projects and activities

Required plan components included in our readings:

- Desired Conditions (DC) the vision
- Objectives (OBJ) concise, measurable, implementing vision
- Standards (STD) do or do not, mandatory constraint [shall not should]
- Guidelines (GDL) like a standard, but with flexibility in how achieved
- (Suitability of lands, Identification of watershed for restoration, Monitoring)

Optional plant content included in our readings:

- Goals (GOAL) broad statement of intent related to process or public
- Management Approaches (PMA) strategies and priorities for implementation
