


### **Thursday 18 September: Christchurch**

10.00am: Group Tour of <u>International Antarctic Centre</u> including:

- an Antarctic storm, this takes place in the Storm Dome ~ filled with real snow and ice chilled to -8°C. Please ensure all members of your group bring a warm jacket with them for their Storm Dome experience.
- The Penguin Rescue facility. Here you can see our colony of rescued Little Blue penguins Kororā.
- Visit the Gallery. This contains interactive Antarctic displays including historical information, many aspects of Antarctic science, and the Husky encounter.
- a ride in the all-terrain Polar vehicle Hägglund. You will traverse steep mounds, a crevasse, and rough terrain! Note that there is a minimum height requirement of 1.2 m to ride the Hägglund.



- a 4D movie experience. This exclusive movie is enhanced with special effects, such as snow falling, bubbles, seat motion, and the occasional water spray.

2.00pm <u>Māori-led Walking Tour</u>

Experience culture in Ōtautahi Christchurch. This 90 minute tailor made walk is a perfect way to discover cultural treasures hidden in plain sight and learn how

local Māori are expressed in the rebuild of the City.

We begin our tour with a mihi whakatau (welcome) and karakia (prayer) to ensure visitors are safe on their journey. We share the creation story of Ranganui (sky father) and Papatūānuku (earth mother) and hear our ancestors

story of how the hongi brought to life Hineahuone.

Following the footsepts of our tipuna (ancestors) we meander our way along the city laneways and river, sharing Māori and settler stories demonstrating

how we are kaitiaki (guardians) for the future.
